Legal News: Required Submission of Rabies Vaccination Certificates to Animal Control Agencies 1.14.2019

Dear colleagues,

Were you aware that most local cities require veterinarians to provide timely copies of rabies certificates to the local animal control agency?

The Los Angeles Civil Grand Jury recently released several recommendations aimed at reducing the euthanasia rates at local animal shelters. Among them was a request that the Department of Public Health remind veterinarians of the requirement to send copies of all rabies certificates to the local animal control agency in most local jurisdictions. In fact, 63 of the 88 cities, and the unincorporated regions in Los Angeles County, have ordinances requiring this (see attached handouts). Your assistance can help increase the number of pets that are licensed and returned to their owners if lost and improve the licensing process.

Los Angeles County veterinarians are advised to:

- 1. Review the attached handout to see if you are required to submit rabies certificates in your city/jurisdiction.
- 2. If you are, contact your local animal control agency to determine how certificates should be sent in (e.g. hard copy or electronic).
- 3. Notify your clients about the requirement.
- 4. Submit copies of rabies certificates to the animal control agency as required by law.

If the city where you practice requires reporting, please contact them if you have questions about the laws or procedures.
