PPC MEETING

I. ROLL CALL

Roll call was taken at 12:10 PM and a quorum was present.

II. COLLOQUIA PRESENTATION

“Policy and Practice Implications of HIV Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) in Los Angeles”
Ron Brooks of the Center for HIV Identification, Prevention and Treatment Services (CHIPTS) provided some background and introduced Thomas J. Coates, PhD and Professor of Global AIDS Research at the David Geffen School of Medicine at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA).

Dr. Coates' presentation covered the following: what PrEP is, reviewed field studies to determine if PrEP could work, identified which studies need to come, the advantages and disadvantages of PrEP as HIV prevention, the relevance of PrEP to the portfolio of HIV prevention services which have been identified for Los Angeles County, and how community-based organizations can integrate PrEP into existing services.

There was a question and answer period following the presentation. A copy of the power point presentation titled “PrEP May Cause a Revolution in HIV Prevention: Time to Get Ready” and the handout titled “Pre-exposure prophylaxis for HIV infection: What if it works” are available upon request.

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V. JOINT PUBLIC POLICY COMMITTEE REPORT

Lee Kochems reported the Joint Public Policy Committee met from 12:00 PM to 5:30 PM on Wednesday, March 4th to review legislation. Mr. Kochems thanked the Joint Public Policy Committee members and all who attended and participated in the meeting. The conversation went well and forty-three (43) pieces of legislation were reviewed. A position was taken on all of the pieces of legislation. The position on each piece of legislation was approved by unanimous consent. The Joint Public Policy Committee will forward their recommendations to the Commission on HIV (COH) on Thursday, March 12th. The Joint Public Policy Committee will forward the recommendations to the HIV Prevention Planning Committee (PPC) at the April 2nd PPC meeting. A motion will be placed on the April 2nd PPC meeting agenda to accept the Joint Public Policy Committee recommendations as approved by the committee. The Joint

Public Policy Committee Legislative Docket with the position taken by the Joint Public Policy Committee is being updated and will be placed on the COH website. Additionally, all of the legislation is on the COH website. Anyone wanting to address any piece of legislation and position should attend the March 12th COH meeting during Public Comment.

Additionally, the Joint Public Policy Committee meeting has been moved from the 1st Wednesday of each month to the 3rd Wednesday of the month. The next Joint Public Policy Committee meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, April 15th from 2:00 PM to 5:00 PM at the COH office.

Lastly, Mr. Kochems reported the Senate is considering the 2009 Omnibus Legislation and Mr. Kochems read an excerpt from the AIDS Action Alert, available on the back table.

VI. PUBLIC COMMENT

- Reverend Russell Thornhill announced Teri Tinsley, a transgender HIV/AIDS activist, transitioned into the life hereafter last week and requested to keep her family in our prayers. The memorial service will be scheduled for next week and an email announcing the arrangements will be sent out.
- Reverend Russell Thornhill announced Odell Walker, a client of the Minority AIDS Project (for many years) transitioned last week and the memorial service for Mr. Walker is scheduled for the morning of Saturday, March 6, 2009 at the Life Wholeness and Wellness Center (next to the Unity Fellowship Church).
- Sophia Rumanes requested to dedicate today's March 5, 2009 HIV Prevention Planning Committee (PPC) meeting to Teri Tinsley, Odell Walker, George Bauer and Senator Nell Soto. A moment of silence was requested.
- Ron Brooks, CHIPTS, announced a study is being conducted on the acceptability of PrEp among sero discordant (one positive and one negative) gay couples. Eligibility for the study and contact information regarding the study is included on the flyer included in today's meeting packet.
- Megan Ralston announced all Walgreen stores in SPA 1 are selling syringes without a prescription.
- Megan Ralston announced the first Southern California Harm Reduction Summit is being scheduled for Friday, July 24th at the California Endowment. Ms. Ralston encouraged individuals and agencies to consider submitting a presentation and/or abstract to be delivered at the first Southern California Harm Reduction Summit. Flyers are on the back table. The organizing committee meets on the first Friday of each month at 1:00 PM at Homeless Healthcare (512 E. 4th Street). Flyers are on the back table and everyone is welcome.
- Ryan Chua announced Women and Girls HIV Awareness Day is March 10th and in recognition of the day, The Asian Pacific AIDS Intervention Team (APAIT) is hosting an event targeting Asian Pacific Islander Women in Long Beach on March 10th. Flyers are on the back table and everyone is invited.
- Scott Campbell provided the 2008 results of the Bath House/Sex Clubs Testing Program. 1,771 tests were completed and 34 positive individuals were found, resulting in a 1.9% positivity rate in the Bath Houses. Additionally, Mr. Campbell shared a peer review paper is being published in the International Journal of STD's and AIDS examining the results from the Bath House Study versus the current (2008) results.

- Becky Blackhawk Peterson, United American Indian Involvement, announced some events surrounding National Native American HIV/AIDS Day. Flyers are on the back table.
- Martha Chono-Helsley announced March 10th is Women and Girls HIV Awareness Day and REACH LA is hosting an event on Friday, March 13th from 12:00 noon to 7:00 PM at El Camino College – Compton Community Education Center (111 E. Artesia Blvd, Compton) in the Student Lounge.
- Valerie Spencer shared words of inspiration about Teri Tinsley and her leadership role in the transgender community.
- Gabriela Leon, ALIANZA Co-Chair, congratulated the PPC for placing the motion on today’s agenda to create a Latino Task Force and encouraged the PPC to support the motion.
- Charles Karsters announced Being Alive has moved to a new location. The address is 7531 Santa Monica Blvd., Suite 100, West Hollywood, CA 90046.
- Jill Rotenberg announced JWCH Institute will continue to coordinate the SPA 4 Service Planning network (SPN) Meetings and the next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, March 19th at 12:00 noon at AIDS Research Alliance.
- Darren Aikens thanked individuals who participated and attended the “Breaking the Silence” viewing and discussion event held last month. Additionally, another event is being planned for May, 2009. For individuals interested in receiving a save the date notice for the May, 2009 event, a signup sheet is on the back table.
- Darren Aikens announced a Black Paper is being developed and is expected to be released during the week of March 9th; individuals interested in receiving a copy of the Black Paper should list their email contact information on the signup sheet on the back table.
- Robert Aguayo announced the passing of another advocate David de La Riva and shared some of the experiences he witnessed by the work of David de La Riva.

VII. COMMUNITY CO-CHAIRS REPORTS

- Nominations for PPC Representatives to the Commission on HIV (COH)
The nomination process of a PPC Representative to the Commission on HIV (COH) remains open.
- Update on Think Tank
Terry Smith announced PPC members should have received a Save the Date for the Think Tank and reminded the invitees to respond to the email. The Think Tank is scheduled for Friday, March 6th at the California Endowment from 9:30 AM to 4:00 PM with Rosemary Veniegas and Uyen Kao, of CHIPTS, facilitating the meeting. Parking will be provided and lunch is on your own.
- Latino Task Force
Terry Smith provided some background on why the PPC creates task forces to address particular issues. Additionally, Mr. Smith informed the group of the goals, outcomes, time frames, and recommendations associated with PPC supported task forces.

Terry Smith placed a motion on the floor to establish a Latino Task Force of the HIV Prevention Planning Committee (PPC) with community partners. David Giugni seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken.

- 2008 CDC Annual Progress Report (APR)
Terry Smith shared one of the responsibilities of the PPC is to review and to provide feedback on the Annual Progress Report (APR). The date of Tuesday, March 17, 2009 from 9:30 AM to 12:30 PM at OAPP has been scheduled for the PPC review of the 2008 APR. Interested individuals are needed to review the APR and to represent the full body of the PPC in voting for concurrence, concurrence with reservations, or non-concurrence.

Terry Smith placed a motion on the floor to schedule the PPC review of the 2008 APR on March 17th at OAPP and authorize individuals who participate in the APR review to represent the full body of the PPC in voting for concurrence, concurrence with reservations, or non-concurrence. Philip Hendricks seconded the motion. A hand vote was taken.

- **PPC Co-Chairs and COH Co-Chairs Meeting**
Terry Smith shared the PPC Co-Chairs met with the COH Co-Chairs to begin discussion/dialogue on how the bodies can work together collectively (collaborate, coordinate and integrate activities). The joint co-chairs intend to meet regularly.
- **HIV Counseling & Testing (HCT) Summit**
Terry Smith shared there is a variety of HCT Initiatives (i.e. Demonstration Projects, City of Pasadena, City of Long Beach, City of Los Angeles, Black AIDS Institute, and AHF, etc.) and the goal of the HCT Summit is to get a clear picture of all of the HIV testing in Los Angeles County and invite those that have indicated large scale testing activities to provide an update on their testing numbers and activities. The PPC has proposed for the HCT Work Group to coordinate and organize the HCT Summit.

VIII. GOVERNMENTAL CO-CHAIRS REPORT

Sophia Rumanes shared Mario Perez is currently in Oakland, California and Ms. Rumanes introduced and welcomed OAPP's newly appointed Medical Director, Jennifer Sayles. Additionally, Ms. Rumanes provided some background on Dr. Sayles and highlighted some of her most recent accomplishments. A notice announcing the appointment of Dr. Jennifer Sayles as OAPP's Medical Director will be sent to providers.

- **Update on Service Reduction/Budget**
Sophia Rumanes shared OAPP has analyzed the 2008 level of service data and the 2009 units of service data. Given the prevention providers reduction for the period of January, 2009 through June, 2009, the reductions may translate to:
 - 1,226 less outreach activities
 - 322 less individual level interventions
 - 230 less people who participate in individual group interventions
 - 17 less individuals receiving comprehensive risk counseling services
 - 118 less individuals receiving community level interventions
 - 1,400 less individuals receiving HIV counseling tests

After Ms. Rumanes report, there were questions and comments. Kathy Watt suggested the numbers shared be placed on a one-page document so individuals can visualize the effects of the state and federal budget cuts.

Ms. Rumanes requested Kyle Baker, OAPP Governmental Relations, to provide an update on the federal issues. Mr. Baker indicated he will be traveling to Washington, D.C. early next week to meet with federal and representatives from other jurisdictions regarding the reductions in services cuts. Mr. Baker shared he will be advocating for additional funding and will report back to the PPC.

- **Update on Prevention Request For Proposals (RFPs)**
Ms. Rumanes shared all of the HIV Counseling and Testing (HCT) RFPs have been reviewed, analyzed and the recommendations are being completed. For the Health Education/Risk Reduction (HE/RR) RFPs, all of the review panels have been completed and the next step is to analyze.
- Ms. Rumanes reported OAPP is developing a community advisory group for social marketing. Applications are available on the OAPP website or by contacting True Pawluk.

The deadline to apply for the OAPP Social Marketing Community Advisory Group has been extended until Friday, March 6th.

- Community Mobilization Initiative (CMI) Presentation
Sophia Rumanes introduced Carlos Vega-Matos, Chief of OAPP Provider Support Services Division, who provided an update and power point presentation on the Community Mobilization Initiative titled “Understanding Community Mobilization within Communities of Color in Los Angeles County”. Mr. Vega-Matos shared OAPP intends to release the RFP for the Community Mobilization Initiative on October 1, 2009 with a 45 day response window. The review will occur from December 2009 through April, 2010 with programs expected to begin on July 1, 2010. A copy of the presentation was distributed and is available upon request. Additionally, a copy of the report was placed on the back table and the report is posted on the OAPP website. There was a question and answer period following the presentation.

Rangell Orunga, OAPP Planning & Research Division, presented a power point presentation summarizing the 2007 HIV Counseling and Testing (HCT) data. A copy of the power point presentation titled HIV Counseling & Testing Summary, 2007 was included in the meeting packet and can be downloaded from the internet through the OAPP web site. Following the presentation, there was a question and answer period.

XI. SUB-COMMITTEE REPORTS

- Operations
Traci Bivens-Davis reported the Operations Subcommittee met on February 10th and reviewed their work plan, looked at a draft of the PPC Member Satisfaction Survey to try to determine if there was some feedback which could be incorporated into the meeting structure, and the goals and objectives on their work plan including but not limited to reviewing PPC membership demographic representation, vacant seats, draft a strategy to fill vacant seats, developing a schedule of presentations on targeted populations (identified in Prevention Plan), provide ongoing education, and develop an interactive meeting structure (discussed at PPC Annual Planning Meeting).

Additionally, Ms. Bivens-Davis shared the Operations Subcommittee reviewed Victor Martinez’ application for PPC membership at the February 10th Operations Subcommittee Meeting and recommends Victor Martinez for PPC membership. Traci Bivens-Davis placed a motion on the floor to approve Victor Martinez for PPC membership and Enrique Topete seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken.

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The motion passed. The next Operations Subcommittee Meeting is scheduled for March 10th at 10:30 AM at OAPP.

- Evaluation
Miguel Martinez reported the Evaluation Subcommittee met and reviewed various pieces of their Work Plan. A portion of the meeting focused on the issue of Evaluation Plans for newly funded OAPP agencies (i.e. how to gather more meaningful data). One of the goals of the Evaluation Subcommittee is to co-sponsor a data summit with the Commission on HIV (COH). Based on conversations with the COH, the dates of December 4th or December 5th were suggested for the Data Summit. The dates for this two day event will change to two days in January, 2010. The next Evaluation Subcommittee meeting is scheduled for March 16th from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM at OAPP.
- Standards & Best Practices
Phil Hendricks reported the Standards & Best Practices Subcommittee met on February 19th and continue to work on their Work Plan which included a re-review of the IDI Recommendations, and designing a tool for research around web based activity among the targeted populations. A meeting is scheduled with the Commission on HIV (COH) Consumer Caucus on March 12th to discuss the integration of prevention and care. The next Standards & Best Practices Subcommittee meeting is scheduled for March 19th at 1:30 PM at OAPP.
 - HIV Counseling and Testing (HCT) Work Group
Precious Stallworth reported the HCT Work group met on February 19th with a large number of HCT providers present. The meeting consisted of updating the HCT Work Plan, an update from JWCH on the Bath House/Sex Clubs Program and a discussion regarding developing a master calendar of HCT activities. The next HCT Work Group meeting is scheduled for March 19th at 10:30 AM at OAPP.

XII. TRANSGENDER TASK FORCE REPORT

In the absence of the Transgender Task Force (TTF) co-chairs, Miguel Martinez announced Bamby Salcedo was appointed co-chair of the TTF replacing Mattee Jim. The last meeting was spent reviewing the data portion of the Beyond the Basics recommendations, discussing other challenges and identifying potential recommendations. The TTF agreed to develop a Work Plan as the TTF is a time sensitive group. The next meeting is March 25th from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM at Childrens Hospital Los Angeles.

XIII. STANDING REPORTS

- City of Los Angeles – Ricki Rosales announced on Thursday, March 12th the City of Los Angeles AIDS Coordinator’s Office is facilitating a City of Los Angeles Hospital Summit with the goal of beginning routine HIV testing within private hospitals in the city of Los Angeles. Thirteen (13) private hospitals have confirmed.

The Mayor of Los Angeles has released his recommendations for the current budget. It appears funded programs will remain at the same level, as this past year. Agencies will be notified that their contracts will be renewed for the next year.

The City of Los Angeles AIDS Coordinator's Office is working with the Los Angeles Police Department to introduce HIV and STD testing within city lock ups.

Discussion has begun around introducing HIV testing in Los Angeles City High Schools controlled by the Mayor of Los Angeles.

- City of West Hollywood – David Giugni announced, in collaboration with LAGLC, four new web episodes of “In the Moment” have been created. Mr. Giugni encouraged everyone to log on to WeHoLife.org website and view the new web episode. Additionally, Mr. Giugni encouraged individuals to complete the online survey after viewing the web episode. The City of West Hollywood has decided to spend their social marketing campaign funds on a print advertisement with characters from the In the Moment intervention.
- City of Long Beach – No Report
- HIV Epidemiology Program (HEP) – Juli-Ann Carlos announced HEP is still on hold for reporting HIV Incidence Estimate data, awaiting a patch from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

In response to a question from last month's PPC meeting, Ms. Carlos reported there is no increase in sites reporting. It appears that HRSA funded sites report more data than HCT funded sites and among HCT sites about 20% to 30% of the cases are not submitted.

- California HIV Prevention Planning Group (CHPG) – Ricki Rosales shared the CHPG is in the process of revamping by interviewing community planning group experts and defining the purpose of community planning groups. The CHPG Design Summit is scheduled for March 18th and March 19th at the Wilshire Grand in Los Angeles.
- Urban Coalition of HIV/AIDS Prevention Services (UCHAPS) – Kathy Watt announced the next UCHAPS meeting is scheduled for later this month in Washington, DC, consisting of a follow up on the Think Tank and visits to the hill. Additionally, weekly conference calls are occurring with the CDC representative and the UCHAPS community co-chairs.
- Incarcerated Task Force – Ron Osorio reported the Incarcerated Task Force has scheduled a Health & Safety Fair on May 16th at the CRDF (Lynwood) facility.

Dr. Nina T. Harawa presented her finding on the Condom Program in Los Angeles County Jails last month to the Sheriff's Department.

Ron Osorio announced the Center for Health Justice has received a large grant to perform HIV testing inside the jails. This grant will be used to fill the gaps between OAPP funded contracts and AHF testing services.

- Precious Stallworth announced the National Lesbian Health Summit is occurring this weekend (03/06/09-03/09/09) in San Francisco, CA.
- Phil Hendricks thanked David Giugni for participating in a community forum.
- Phil Hendricks announced the curriculum for active Crystal Meth Users has been translated into Spanish. The group meets on Tuesdays from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM.
- Traci Bivens-Davis announced on March 10th in honor of Women’s & Girls HIV Awareness Day, SPA 5 and Common Ground are hosting a community forum for Westside providers from 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM.
- David Giugni encouraged someone from the PPC to volunteer for the PPC seat on the COH and/or discuss other options to ensure the PPC voice is represented at the COH.
