The goals of the Coalition are described in the document "*Controlling Asthma in Los Angeles: A Call to Action*" (downloadable at http://lapublichealth.org/mch/CHI/chi_asthma.htm). The six key recommendations in the Call to Action comprise the goals of the Coalition. They are to:

1. Increase access to and improve quality of health care;
2. Improve indoor air quality in homes and workplaces;
3. Improve asthma management in schools, child care centers, and child care homes;
4. Improve outdoor air quality;
5. Address race/ethnic and socio-economic disparities; and
6. Strengthen research related to asthma.

When we meet:

The Coalition holds meetings on a quarterly basis. All interested stakeholder are invited to attend. The 2010 meetings are January 25, April 26, July 26, and October 25

The Steering Committee meets monthly, excluding the months of a general coalition meeting. The 2010 meetings are: February 10, March 10, May 12, June 9, August 11, September 8, November 10 and December 8.
