Public Health Investigation (PHI) Responsibilities

- Mandated functions of Health Officer related to communicable disease intervention and control
- Enforcement of laws related to communicable disease control
- Remove threats to the public's health

- Locate cases and contacts to disease and refer for medical care
- Educate clients

Areas of PHI Practice

- Sexually Transmitted Diseases and HIV/AIDS Custody Divisions and STD Field Services HIV Epidemiology Program
- Tuberculosis Control Program
- Acute Communicable Diseases
- Substance Abuse Prevention and Control Program
- Response to Public Health Emergencies



STD and HIV/AIDS

- Locate, educate, and refer patients for exam and treatment
- Elicit sex partners and clusters
- Verify treatment of sex partners
- Client education
- HIV pre/post test counseling

Commercial Sex Venue Inspections (aka: Bathhouses)


- Los Angeles County issues health permits to CSVs per county ordinance.
- Monitor for unsafe sexual practices as stated in the county ordinance.
- Increase the awareness of behaviors that increase the risks of contracting STD/HIV.



Marine Biotoxin Monitoring

- Annual Mussel Quarantine
- Water Column Sampling
- Bait Shop Inspections





Custodian of Records

- Respond to Public Health Records Requests
- Respond to Subpoena duces tecum
- Issues Port of Entry letters for body shipments



Homebirth Verification

• Investigate births that occur outside of the hospital to facilitate issuance of a birth certificate.

Must be done within the one year of the child's birth




PHI Bioterrorism Responsibilities

- Case Education and Interview
- Contact Elicitation and Identification
- Contact Tracing and Referral
- Contact Surveillance
- Isolation and Quarantine
- Compliance Monitoring
- Violations



TB Intervention



- Elicit cooperation of non-compliant patients
- Locate patients lost to follow-up
- Investigative work needed to locate potentially exposed persons
- Compel compliance through the Legal Order process



ACD Intervention

- Elicit cooperation of non-compliant patients
- Locate patients lost to follow-up
- Investigative work needed to locate potentially exposed persons
- Enforcement authority of the Health Officer necessary to achieve compliance

How Does PHI Get Assigned Work?





Positive Labs

- PMD (clinics, hospitals, or labs) by law must report positive labs on STD & Communicable diseases to the local health department
- The report is Confidential Morbidity Report (CMR)
- PHIs are assigned HDFUs, Interview Records, or Field Records from Casewatch system

PHI and Nursing Synergy

REFERRAL CRITERIA

- Non-compliant patients
- Lost to follow-up patients
- Legal Intervention

REFERRAL PROCESS

- PHN exhausts efforts
- PHNS referral to SPHI
- PHI exhausts efforts to locate or gain compliance
- PHN oversight vs. Legal Order
