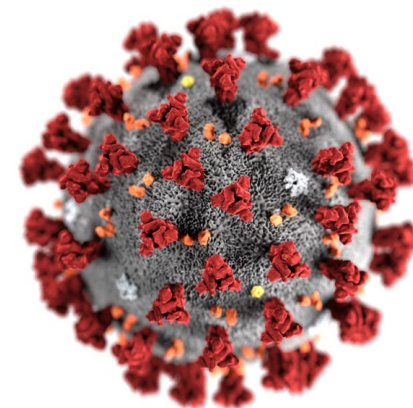

COVID-19 Situational Updates

There has not been a significant uptick of COVID-19 cases after Halloween and the Thanksgiving holiday, but the situation remains highly fluid, with the emergence of the Omicron variant highlighting the ongoing importance of vaccines, boosters, and ongoing precautions.



- **Omicron Variant**

- We are still learning about the new Omicron variant, including how it spreads and how it responds to vaccines. Here is what we know right now:
 - This new variant has many mutations in important areas of the virus that impact infectiousness and the ability for immune systems to protect from infection.
 - Some of the mutations are concerning to scientists because they are very different from other variants previously detected.
 - We do not know at this time if this new variant causes more severe COVID-19 illness than other variants or how it might impact response to treatment, but right now, there is no evidence associating the Omicron variant with more severe disease but there is likelihood that it has enhanced transmissibility.



Timely Prevention Claims

Many providers submitted late claims past SAPC's deadline of July 10th this year.

Due to stricter requirements by DHCS, many of these late claims resulted in SAPC being unable to use intended block grant dollars for this service. This inefficiency results in lots resources and harms both SAPC and its provider network because SAPC is no longer able to rollover unused block grant funds from year to year.

Moving forward, SAPC will not permit late claims submissions, particularly as SAPC will not have additional funding capacity to offset these late claims.

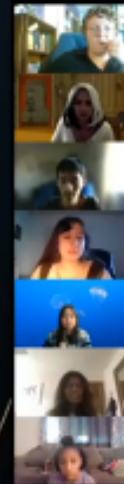

- 2 NOT SHARING** NEVER SHARE RX MEDICATIONS! SHARING RX MEDICATIONS CAN LEAD TO MISUSE & ABUSE, OR EVEN AN OVERDOSE!

A proliferation of Smoke-Shops (Vape-Shops) in San Fernando Valley communities, as well as throughout the city and county of Los Angeles, may be a key contributing factor to youth vaping incidents on school campuses.

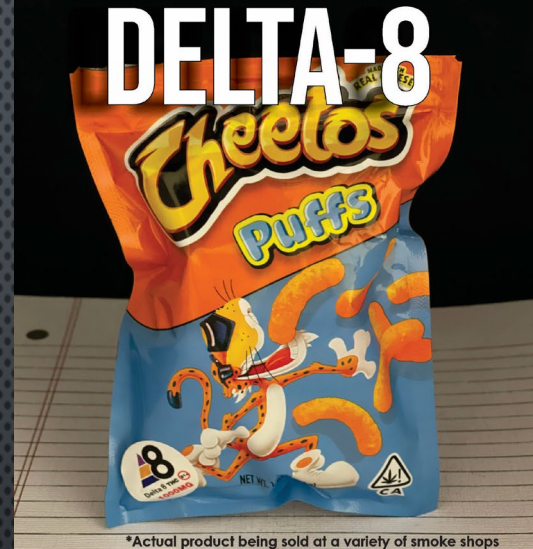
Context:

WHAT OUR SCHOOLS AND COMMUNITIES NEED TO KNOW

Delta-8 tetrahydrocannabinol, also known as Delta-8 THC, is a psychoactive substance found in the Cannabis Sativa plant, of which marijuana and hemp are two varieties. Delta-8 THC is one of over 100 cannabinoids produced naturally by the cannabis plant but is not found in significant amounts in the cannabis plant. As a result, concentrated amounts of Delta-8 THC are typically manufactured from hemp-derived cannabidiol (CBD).

It is important for consumers to be aware that Delta-8 THC products have not been evaluated or approved by the FDA for safe use in any context. They may be marketed in ways that put the public health at risk and should especially be kept out of reach of children and pets.
